

#### Structure

The American Legion was chartered and incorporated by Congress in 1919 as a patriotic veterans' organization devoted to mutual helpfulness. It is the nation's largest wartime veterans service organization, committed to mentoring youth and sponsorship of wholesome programs in our communities, advocating patriotism and honor, promoting strong national security, and continued devotion to our fellow servicemembers and veterans. It has a worldwide membership of 2.8 million.

The Department of Virginia is comprised of 212 posts divided into 17 Districts with over 33,500 members. The Sixteenth District is the second largest District in Virginia with over 4000 members.

The American Legion is a nonpartisan, not-for-profit organization with great political influence perpetuated by its grass-roots involvement in the legislation process from local districts to Capitol Hill. Legionnaires' sense of obligation to community, state and nation drives an honest advocacy for veterans. The Legion stands behind the issues most important to the nation's veterans' community, backed by resolutions passed by volunteer leadership.

American Legion members provided over 4 million volunteer hours last year nationwide, provided almost \$8 million dollars for Community Service/Emergency Aid/Troop Support, provided over \$15 million dollars for Youth Programs (Baseball, Boys State, Oratorical Contests, Scholarships, Scouting, and Shooting Sports), and helped with the donation of over 70,000 pints of blood.

#### **Sixteenth District**

The Sixteenth District encompasses the counties of Culpeper, Fauquier, Loudoun, Prince William, Rappahannock, and Stafford. Cities include Ashburn, Culpeper, Haymarket, Leesburg, Manassas, Manassas Park, Middleburg, Purcellville, Quantico, Remington, Stafford, Sterling, Warrenton, and Woodbridge. The Sixteenth District contains the Leonard W. Kidd Memorial Post 2001 and the following posts:

#### About

American Legion Post 2001 was created in honor of Leonard W. Kidd. On July 27, 1970, SP5 Kidd, was mortally wounded in the Quang Tin province of Vietnam. He was a heavy construction equipment Operator, on a 90-day extended tour overseas. His biography is included on the Vietnam Memorial (PANEL 8W, LINE 59).

We meet monthly on the second Thursday of the month at 1930PM at the Ashburn Volunteer Fire and Rescue Department Station Six, 20688 Ashburn Road. If necessary, we meet virtually via Zoom conference rooms. Because we do not own a building, all of our efforts and finances are focused strictly in the mission areas mentioned in the 'Summarized Post 2001 Activities' section. 
#### Americanism:

- Post 2001 coordinated a Vietnam Veterans pinning ceremony for 25 veterans and 25 surviving spouses in special recognition of their service during that war.
- The Post 2001 sponsored a Flag Retirement Ceremony with a local Boy Scout troop in which over 250 American flags were properly retired.
- An Eagle Scout project we sponsored several years ago provided collection boxes in six local communities, including our HOA office area, so that any resident can drop off worn flags for collection by Post members.

- Over the past 6 years, excluding 2020, we have sponsored 56 Boys to attend the American Legion's Boys State and 61 Girls to attend the American Legion Ladies Auxiliary Girls State programs.
- On Memorial Day and Veterans Day weekends, Post Legionnaires hand out approximately 5,000 paper poppies in remembrance of those who served and/or have lost their lives serving in the Armed Forces.

<u>Mentoring our Youth</u>: Post 2001 coordinated and helped to fully sponsor (no cost to the student) 16 junior class boys and girls from 7 of our local High Schools, including Riverside and Stone Bridge, to attend a life-changing, weeklong Virginia Boys or Girls State educational program. The cost is approximately \$400 per student.

At Post 2001, we also created a charitable foundation in Leonard's name to help fellow military veterans in SP5 Kidd's home area of Loudoun County. To further honor his memory, we have pulled together a glimpse of SP5's Leonard W. Kidd's probable environment and surroundings during the Vietnam war. The following photos would be the closest resemblance to Landing Zone Highboy, from 1969.

#### **Notable Achievements**

- Ongoing Rent/Utility Payments (Loudoun County Veterans facing homelessness)
  - Since 2016, the Post has provided critical, emergency financial funds in excess of \$73,000 to service providers (landlords, utilities, medical, etc.) which assisted 90 Veterans and their total of 221 family members in time of need.
- In 2018, the Post partnered with the Rock Ridge High School Girls Softball team and their Head coach to purchase and install a Flagpole at their softball field. The

American Flag can now be seen during the playing of the national anthem at all home games. For this, the Post was cited in Virginia House Resolution No. 880.








Currently, American Legion Post 2001 represents five of the United States military's branches and has 108 active members with the following demography:
